5. Cleaning

Unplug this projector from the wall outlet before cleaning it. Do not use liquid aerosol cleaners. Use a damp soft cloth for cleaning.

6. Attachments and equipment

Never add any attachments and/or equipment without the approval of the manufacturer as such additions may result in the risk of fire, electric shock or other personal injury.

7. Water and moisture

Do not use this projector near water or in contact with water.

8. Accessories



- The UP and DOWN buttons are used in the KEY-STONE adjustment in addition to the volume control.

### Battery installation

Use two (AA, R6) size batteries.

- 1. Remove the back cover of the remote control by pushing the battery compartment door in the direction of the arrow.
- 2. Load the batteries making sure that they are positioned correctly (+ to +, and to -).
- Load the batteries from spring side, and make sure to set them tightly.
- 3. Replace the back cover.




### Caution:

- Use of a battery of wrong type may cause explosion.
- Only Carbon-Zinc or Alkaline-Manganese Dioxide type batteries should be used.
- Dispose of used batteries according to your local regulations.
- · Batteries may explode if misused. Do not recharge, disassemble, or dispose of in fire.

- Load the battery with its positive (+) and negative (-) sides correctly oriented as indicated on the remote control.


### Operation range (of the remote control)

The maximum operation distance of the remote control is about 10 m (or about 32 feet) when the remote control is pointed at the remote control sensor of the projector. When the remote control is pointed to the screen, the distance from the remote control to the projector via the screen should be 5 m or less. However, the operation distance varies depending on the type of the screen used.


### **Reception angle (vertical)**

Reception angle (vertical), ceiling mount





- Do not expose the remote control sensor to direct sunlight or fluorescent. Keep a distance at least 2 m (6.5 feet) between the remote control sensor and the fluorescent light to ensure correct operation of the remote control.
- Inverted fluorescent light, if located near the projector, may interfere the remote control.
  When you use the remote control too close to the remote control sensor, the remote control may not work correctly.



### Front projection, ceiling mounting


For ceiling mounting, you need the ceiling mount kit designed for this projector. Ask a specialist for installation.

For details, consult your dealer.

The warranty on this projector does not cover any damage caused by use of any non-recommended ceiling mount kit or installation of the ceiling mount kit in an improper location.



- When using the projector mounted on the ceiling, be sure to tilt the antenna downward. If you tilt the antenna upward, the projector cannot be installed properly.
- When using the projector mounted on the ceiling, set IMAGE REVERSE in the INSTALLATION menu to MIRROR INVERT. See page 33.
- When the projector is mounted on the ceiling, images may appear darker than those projected in the case of tabletop mounting. This isn't a product malfunction.



For rear projection, set IMAGE REVERSE in the INSTALLATION menu to MIRROR. See page 33.

### Caution:

**Rear projection** 

- Placing the projector directly on a carpet impairs ventilation by the fans, causing damage or failure. Put a hard board under the projector to facilitate ventilation.
- Place the projector at least 50 cm (or 20 inch) away from the wall to prevent the air inlet grille and the air outlet grilles that emit hot air from being blocked.
- Do not use the projector in the following locations and manners, which may cause fire or electric shock.
  - In a dusty or humid place.
  - In a sideways or upside-down position.
  - Near a heater.
  - In an oily, smoky, or damp place such as a kitchen.
  - In direct sunlight. •
  - Where the temperature rises high, such as in a closed car. •
  - Where the temperature is lower than +41°F (or +5°C) or higher than +95°F (or +35°C ).

- Do not apply force to the lens, because the lens may be damaged.
- We don't recommend using the projector at an altitude of 1500 meters or higher. Use at an altitude of 1500 meters or higher may affect the projector's life.


# Basic connections

This projector can be connected with various devices such as a VCR, video camera, videodisc player, and personal computer that have analog RGB output connectors.

### Important:

- Make sure that the connected device is turned off before starting connection.
- Plug in the power cords of the projector and the connected devices firmly. When unplugging, hold and pull the plug. Do not pull the cord.
- When the projector and the connected devices are located too close to each other, the projected image may be affected by their interference.
- See the owner's guide of each device for details about its connections.


### **Projector + AV device**



- Match the colors of the video and audio plugs on the Audio cable with those of the terminals.
- Speaker output is mono.

### Projector + DVD player or HDTV decoder


Some DVD players have an output connector for 3-line fitting (Y, CB, CR). When connecting such DVD player with this projector, use the COMPUTER-IN terminal.



- The terminal's names Y, PB, and PR are given as examples of when a HDTV decoder is connected.
- The terminal's names vary depending on the connected devices.
- Use a Mini D-SUB 15-pin BNC conversion cable for connection.
- Image may not be projected correctly with some DVD players.
- When connecting a HDTV decoder having RGB output terminals, set COMPUTER INPUT to RGB in the SIGNAL menu.
- Speaker output is mono.
- Only the RGB signal is supported. Color difference signals are not supported.

### Projector + Computer

### For computer with Mini D-SUB or DVI-D



### For analog connection:

- 1. Connect one end of the supplied RGB cable to the COMPUTER-IN terminal (1, 2) of the projector.
- 2. Connect the other end of the RGB cable to the monitor port of the computer.

### For digital connection:

- 1. Connect one end of the DVI-D cable to the DVI-D (HDCP) terminal of the projector.
- 2. Connect the other end of the DVI-D cable to the monitor port of the computer.
- If you start the computer first, images may not be displayed.
- The DVI-D (HDCP) terminal of this projector supports DDC2B. If the projector is connected to a computer which supports the standard, the computer automatically reads out the information about the projector to output appropriate images.
- If the projector is connected to a computer which supports DDC, plug the power plug of the projector into the wall outlet, and then start the computer.
- The DVI type that the projector supports is DVI-D (digital). DVI-A (analog) cannot be used with the projector.
- If a computer has a DVI-I (digital and analog) output connector, you can connect the projector with a DVI-D cable.
- · Use the AUDIO-IN terminal for the audio input.

### For monitor connection:

Connect the RGB cable from the monitor to the MONITOR OUT terminal of the projector.

- · Images may not be displayed correctly depending on the type of the input signal. See the instruction manual of the monitor.
- Signals are coming from the COMPUTER-IN terminal (1 or 2) of the projector.
- When signals are coming from both COMPUTER-IN terminals (1, 2), images are projected from the terminal (1 or 2) currently or last selected in the projector's menu.

### Important:

- · When you use a longer RGB cable instead of the provided cable, the image may not be projected correctly.
- Some computers require additional connectors or analog RGB output adapters to be connected with this projector. Contact your dealer for further information.
- This projector uses stereo pin jack for its audio input. Check the type of the audio output terminal of the connected computer and prepare a
  proper cable for connection. Some computers don't have the audio output terminal.
- Speaker output is mono.
- When the audio cable is connected to the AUDIO-OUT terminal, the speaker output is muted.
- While the DVI-D terminal is being used or while an image is being projected wirelessly, you cannot use the MONITOR OUT terminal.

### For Macintosh

- If your Macintosh has no video port, a monitor output adapter is required. Contact your dealer for further information.
- Some Macintoshes require a MAC adapter for the RGB cable for connection with this projector. Contact your dealer for further information.

### About DDC

The COMPUTER/COMPONENT VIDEO IN-1 terminal of this projector complies with the DDC 1/2B standard. When a computer supporting this standard is connected to this terminal, the computer will automatically load the information from this projector and prepare for output of appropriate images.

 After connecting a computer supporting this standard to this terminal, plug the power cord of the projector in the wall outlet first, and then boot up the computer.

### Preparation for projection

- 1. Attach the provided power cord to the projector.
- 2. Plug the power cord in the wall outlet.
- 3. Remove the lens cap.

### Warning:

- Do not look into the lens directly when the projector is on.
- The lens cap is for protecting the lens. If you leave the lens cap on the lens with the projector turned on, it may be deformed because of heat build-up. Remove the lens cap when you turn on the projector.
- One of power cords for the U.S., Europe and U.K. is provided appropriately.
- This projector uses the power plug of three-pin grounding type. Do
  not remove the grounding pin from the power plug. If the power
  plug doesn't fit your wall outlet, ask an electrician to change the
  wall outlet.
- In case that the power cord for the U.S is provided with this projector, never connect this cord to any outlet or power supply using other voltages or frequencies than rated. If you want to use a power supply using other voltage than rated, prepare an appropriate power cord separately.
- Use 100-240 V AC 50/60 Hz to prevent fire or electric shock.
- Do not place any objects on the power cord or do not place the projector near heat sources to prevent damage to the power cord. If the power cord should be damaged, contact your dealer for replacement because it may cause fire or electric shock.
- Do not modify or alter the power cord. If the power cord is modified or altered, it may cause fire or electric shock.

### Caution:


- Plug in the power cord firmly. When unplugging, hold and pull the power plug, not the power cord.
- Do not plug in or out the power cord with your hand wet. It may cause electric shock.

### Adjustment of the projection angle

For the best projection, project images on a flat screen installed at 90 degrees to the floor. If necessary, tilt the projector using the two adjustment feet on the bottom of the projector.

### Using the adjustment feet (front)

- 1. Tilt up the projector to the appropriate angle.
- 2. Press the foot adjustment button (front).
- 3. Release the foot adjustment button (front) after fine adjusting a position of lengthwise direction of the image.



### After using the projector:

4. Put the adjustment feet (front) back into the projector by pressing the foot adjustment buttons.



### Using the adjustment feet (rear)

- 1. Tilt up the projector to the appropriate angle.
- 2. Rotate the adjustment feet (rear) for fine adjustment.

### Important:

- Install the screen on a flat wall at 90 degrees to the floor.
- Slanting the projector more than ±10° (right and left) or ±15° (front and rear) may cause trouble or explosion of the lamp. You can tilt the projector up to 8 degrees using the adjustment feet only.
- Images may not be projected in a shape of a regular rectangle or with its aspect ratio 4:3, depending on the installation conditions of the projector and the screen.
- To correct vertical keystone distortion, press the KEYSTONE button on the projector or the remote control to display KEYSTONE, and adjust the image by pressing the ▲, ▼ button (or VOLUME ▲, ▼ button on the remote control).

### In the following cases:



Press the ▼ button.

- When the keystone adjustment is carried out, the adjustment value is indicated. Note that this value doesn't mean a projection angle.
- The allowable range of the adjustment value in the keystone adjustment varies depending on the installation conditions.
- When the keystone adjustment takes effect, the resolution decreases. In addition, stripes may appear or straight lines may bend in images with complicated patterns. They are not due to product malfunctions.
- Noise may appear on the screen during the keystone adjustment because of the type of the video signal being projected and the setting values of the keystone adjustment. In such cases, set the keystone adjustment values in the range where the image is displayed without noise.
- When the keystone adjustment is carried out, the image may not be displayed correctly because of the type of input signal.

# Basic operation



- Turn on the device connected to the projector first.
- 2. Plug the power cord in the wall outlet.
- The POWER indicator lights up.
  - If the power cord is unplugged from the wall outlet before the projector is cooled down completely after use, the fans may start rotating when the power cord is plugged in next time and the POWER button may not function. In this case, wait for the fans to stop and press the POWER button to light the indicator.
- Press the POWER button on the control panel or the ON button on the remote control.
  - It may take about one minute for the lamp to light up.
  - The lamp occasionally fails to light up. Wait a few minutes and try to light the lamp again.
  - After the POWER button is pressed, the image may flicker before the lamp becomes stable. This is not a product malfunction.
  - Regardless of the setting of LAMP MODE in the INSTALLA-TION menu, the STANDARD lamp mode is activated by default. The LAMP MODE is set to either STANDARD or LOW depending on the setting last selected, and you cannot switch the LAMP MODE in about one minute after the lamp is on.

### Important:

- If the lamp exceptionally turned off due to the power interruption or voltage drop, it can happen that the lamp does not turn on even if you switch again the power supply on. In that case, please pull the electric cord out of the consent and put it again in the consent about 10 minutes later.
- Do not cover the lens with the lens cap while the lamp is on.
- The projector starts warming up when the POWER button is pressed. During the warm-up process, images may appear dark and no commands are accepted.

- By blinking red, the STATUS indicator indicates that the lamp should be replaced soon. Replace the lamp when the STATUS indicator blinks red. (See page 42 and 46.)
- Images may not be projected with good quality in an extremely hot or cold environment. (This is not a product malfunction.)
- 4. Adjust the focus by turning the focus ring.
- Choose your desired external input source using the COM-PUTER or VIDEO or DVI button.
  - The input source is switched from VIDEO to COMPUTER at the press of the COMPUTER button on the control panel.
  - The input source is switched between VIDEO and S-VIDEO at every press of the VIDEO button on the control panel.
  - Each time you press the COMPUTER button on the control panel, the input source is switched in the order of "COM-PUTER 1" → "COMPUTER 2" → "DVI" → "WIRELESS".
  - The projector automatically selects the appropriate signal format. The selected signal format is displayed on the screen.
  - The COMPUTER and VIDEO buttons don't function while the menu is being displayed.
  - When COMPUTER is chosen as the source, images supplied from the computer may flicker. Press the ◀ or ► button on the remote control to reduce flicker, if it occurs.
  - To avoid permanently imprinting a fixed image onto your projector, please do not display the same stationary images for long period.
  - If you want to project images wirelessly, see page 21.
- 6. Adjust the image size by turning the zoom ring.
  - If necessary, adjust the focus and zoom again.

### When fine streaks are seen on projected images

This is due to interference with the screen surface and is not a malfunction. Replace the screen or displace the focus a little.

### Power-off

Use the following procedure to turn off the projector. The lamp may deteriorate if the projector is powered off and on repeatedly within 30 minutes after the lamp is lighted.

- 1. Press the POWER button on the control panel or the OFF button on the remote control.
  - The message "POWER OFF? YES : PRESS AGAIN" appears on the screen.
  - To cancel, press any button except the POWER button. (Some buttons on the remote control don't function for cancel.)
- 2. Press the POWER button on the control panel or the OFF button on the remote control within 10 seconds again.
  - The lamp will go out and the STATUS indicator will start blinking.
  - Though the lamp goes out at this second press of the POWER button (or OFF button), the air outlet fans continue operating for one minute to cool down the lamp. The STATUS indicator will stop blinking.
  - After stopping the air outlet fans, if the temperature inside the set is still high, the temperature sensor detects it and then the air outlet fans may start again.
- 3. Unplug the power cord.
  - The POWER indicator will go out.
  - If the power cord should be unplugged accidentally while either the air inlet fan or the air outlet fans are operating or the lamp is on, allow the projector to cool down for 10 minutes with the power off. To light the lamp again, press the POWER button (or OFF button). If the lamp doesn't light up immediately, repeat pressing the POWER button (or OFF button) two or three times. If it should still fail to light up, replace the lamp.

### Notice:

• When storing the projector in the carrying case, the lens should face up.

### **Instant Shut Down**

You don't have to wait for the cooling fan to cease operation after powering off the projector. You can unplug the power cord right after the projector is powered off.

- Don't shut down the projector while the STATUS indicator is blinking after the lamp lights up because the lamp's life may be shortened.
- Don't turn the projector back on right after shutting it down because the lamp's life may be shortened. (Wait about 10 minutes before turning the projector back on.)
- Before shutting down the projector, be sure to close the menu screen. If you shut down the projector without closing the menu, the setting data of the menu may not be saved.

### **AUTO POSITION button**

When the image isn't projected in the right position with COMPUTER selected as the input source, follow the procedure below.

- 1. Project a bright image such as the "Recycle Bin" window on the full screen.
- 2. If the screen saver is running, turn it off.
- 3. Press the AUTO POSITION button.
  - If the image is still not in the right position, adjust the image position using the SIGNAL menu. See page 35.

### Volume from the speaker

Press the VOLUME  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\checkmark$  button to change the volume from the speaker.

The volume control bar will appear on the screen.



- The volume control bar will disappear about 10 seconds after the VOLUME button is released.
- The VOLUME buttons don't function while the menu selection bar or the menu is being displayed.
- When a high-level audio signal, such as a DVD audio signal, is supplied to the AUDIO-IN terminal, the output from the speaker may be distorted.

### AV mute

The video and audio signals are temporarily muted when the AV MUTE button is pressed. To cancel muting, press the AV MUTE button again.

### Setting the aspect ratio

You can change the aspect ratio of the input video signal (or the ratio of width to height of the image). Change the setting according to the type of the input video signal.

### How to change the settings:

### With the remote control:

- 1. Press the ASPECT button.
  - Every time the ASPECT button is pressed, the aspect mode changes from AUTO to 16:9, to FULL, and back to AUTO.

### With the FEATURE menu:

- (See page 34 for menu setting.)
- 1. Display the FEATURE menu.
- 2. Select ASPECT by pressing the  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  button.
- 4. Press the ENTER button.
- Select your desired position (CENTER, UPPER or LOWER) by pressing the ◄ or ► button.

### To cancel the menu:

6. Press the MENU button.

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### Important:

 When a 16:9 image is kept displayed for a long time before displaying 4:3 image, the afterimages of the black bars may appear on the 4:3 image screen. Consult your dealer in this case.

### Caution:

- After using the projector, wait one minute for the air outlet fans to stop in normal use. Then unplug the power cord from the wall outlet.
- The lamp can't be lit again for one minute after turned off for safety purpose. It will take another one minute for the STATUS indicator to go out. If you want to turn on the projector again, wait until the indicator goes out, and then press the POWER button.
- The air outlet fans rotate faster as the temperature around the projector rises.
- When the temperature around the projector rises high, the sign "TEMPERATURE!!" blinks red on the screen. If the temperature stays high, the lamp will go out automatically.

### Important:

 Do not display a still picture for a long time because the afterimages may persist on the screen.

### Wall Screen

This function is to reproduce natural color tones when images are projected directly onto a screen or wall surface. You can select from BEIGE, LIGHT BLUE, LIGHT GREEN, PINK, BLACK BOARD, WHITE BOARD, and OFF, to match the color of the screen or wall to be used for projection.

1. Display the INSTALLATION menu. (See page 33 for more details.)



- 2. Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select WALL SCREEN.
- Press the ◄ or ➤ button to select the color closest to that of the screen on which images are projected.
  - When the GAMMA mode setting is changed, images may not be displayed correctly.
  - When OFF or BLACK BOARD/WHITE BOARD is selected, the density cannot be adjusted.
  - When WHITE BOARD is selected, BrilliantColor<sup>TM</sup> in the Color Enhancer menu of the Image menu cannot be used. Additionally, Theater in the Color Enhancer menu of the Image menu has no effect and is automatically canceled when WHITE BOARD is selected.
- 4. Press the ENTER button.

LIGHT BLUE

 Press the ◄ or ▶ button to adjust the density of the selected color.

### When connecting to a laptop computer:

When this projector is connected to a laptop computer, there may be times when images may not be projected. When it occurs, set the computer so that it can output signals externally. The procedure varies across computers in use. See the instruction manual of your computer. The projector operates in a 2.4 GHz band for its wireless LAN capabilities. No license is required for use. Before using the projector, read the following instructions thoroughly and carefully and always observe them.

### Do not use the wireless function in the vicinity of other wireless appliances.

The following appliances may use the same radio wave band as the projector. If the projector is used in the vicinity of the following appliances, the projector may not be able to communicate or the communication speed may drop due to radio wave interference.

- A microwave oven and other appliances
- Industrial, scientific, or medical appliances
- A wireless base station typically installed at factory's manufacturing lines for use in classification of moving objects
- A low-power wireless base station

### Wireless LAN signals barely trickle through steel, metal, stone, or concrete.

Wireless LAN signals trickle through wood or glass free of metal mesh. However, when steel, metal, stone, or concrete is used as the wall or floor material, the signals barely trickle through it.

### Do not place the projector on a carpet, cushion, or bedding that may cause static electricity.

LAN communications, whether they are wired or wireless, may be interrupted when you place the projector on a carpet, cushion, or bedding that may cause static electricity. Should you experience such problems, disconnect your connection, try to hold static electricity or remove noise sources, and reconnect your connection.

Your connection may not be connected due to static electricity or noise. Should you experience such problems, press the Power button on the control panel or remote control to turn off the projector.

### In an environment where there are many wireless devices, you may not be able to connect the projector.

# Security precautions for wireless

Because leakage of your privacy information via the projector and abusive manipulation, interference, suspension, etc. of the projector by a malicious third person can be assumed, read the following precautions thoroughly and carefully and take appropriate security measures accordingly before using the projector.

### Security measures

- Use the WEP encryption equipped with the projector.
- Use the Conference Control mode.
- Specify or change the passwords for the Conference Control mode and network setting to those cannot be easily guessed.

### About wireless LAN network

Wireless LAN (WLAN) devices such as cards, routers, and access points provide security features. You can secure your wireless network by enabling these security features to use the projector securely.

# Software license agreement for wireless

Using the following procedure, you can download and install the software for wireless communication from the projector. Before using the projector, read and agree to the terms and conditions of the following software license agreement in advance.

### License

The licensee is granted a license to use this software (information downloaded from the wireless projector), but not copyrights and intellectual property rights.

### **Computer Usage**

The licensee may run the software on computers that the licensee owns or manages when using the projector.

### **Modification Restrictions**

The licensee shall not evaluate or modify the software.

Mitsubishi Electric Corporation or the licensee's dealer shall not be responsible for accidents or damages that may occur as a result of improper use or attempts to evaluate or modify the software on the part of the licensee.

### After-sales Service

If you have a problem with the software during the use, please contact us by phone or correspondence. We can give you the required information such as an identified error (bug) and usage improvement for your inquiry. The software specifications may be changed without notice.

### Limitation of Liability

Our responsibility for the software is limited only to the above after-sales service. Mitsubishi Electric Corporation or the licensee's dealer shall not be responsible for, and shall not pay any amount of incidental, consequential or other indirect damages, whether based on lost revenue or otherwise, claimed by the licensee or anyone else. 

- This data projector supports IEEE802.11b/g.
- When you use the wireless connection, the MONITOR OUT terminal, AUDIO-IN terminal, and AUDIO-OUT terminal cannot be used.
- When you use the wireless connection and wired LAN connection, audio is not output.

### A. Connecting the antenna

### Preparation

Make sure that the projector and the computer are turned off.



- 1. Connect the supplied antenna to the antenna terminal.
- 2. Stand the antenna up.
  - · Connect the antenna firmly so that it cannot be removed.



### D. Switching the input source

1. Press the WIRELESS button on the remote control or the COM-PUTER button on the control panel.



- Each time you press the COMPUTER button on the control panel, the input source is switched in the order of "COM-PUTER 1" → "COMPUTER 2" → "DVI" → "WIRELESS".
- When the screen flickers, press the ◀ or ► button on the remote control to reduce the flicker.

If you switch the input source to WIRELESS, the starting screen appears, and then the following screen appears.



### E. Connecting wirelessly

- Be sure to specify the settings as a user with Administrator rights.
- Log on to the computer as a user with Administrator rights in advance, and then check if the wireless connection is available. (For more details, see the manual of your computer.)
- 1. Turn the computer on.
- 2. Click the Start button, then select "Control Panel".
- 3. Click "Network and Internet Connections".
- 4. Click "Network Connections".
- Right-click "Wireless Network Connection" to select "View Available Wireless Networks".

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- If the wireless connection is set to "Disable", right-click "Wireless Network Connection" to select "Enable".
- 6. Select "Wireless Projector \*\*\*", then click the [Connect] button.

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- If the projector is wirelessly connected to the computer successfully, "Connected" appears.
- The connection takes approximately one minute.
- If your computer and the projector are already connected wirelessly, close the window.
- If the projector and computer cannot be connected wirelessly, see page 44.
- You can change the character string subsequent to "Wireless Projector" in the administration screen.

### F. Installing the connection software

Install the connection software "Wireless Projector" which is required to project images on computer screens using this projector.

- Be sure to specify the settings as a user with Administrator rights.
- 1. Run the Web browser. (Example: Internet Explorer)
  - The administration screen is displayed.
  - If the screen is not displayed, display the "Wireless Network Connection" properties of your computer, and then check that "Obtain an IP address automatically" and "Obtain DNS server address automatically" are selected in the "Internet Protocol (TCP/IP)" properties.
  - If the screen is not displayed, access "http://(the IP address of the projector)". The IP address is a numeric value displayed in "Server IP:" in the projected image.

- 2. Click "Download".



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- 3. Click the [Download] button.
- 4. Click the [Save] button.
  - You can install the software directly without saving it.
  - If it takes a long time to download the software, click the

- 5. Specify the directory to save, and then click the [Save] button.
- 6. Double-click the file "Wireless Projector.exe" saved in Step 5.
- 7. Click the [Run] button.
- 8. Click the [Next >] button.
- The installation of "Wireless Projector" starts.
- · When completing the installation, the connection software runs.
- If you install the software again during the wireless connection, the installation process stops. In this case, exit "Wireless Projector" once.







- Click the () icon for the computer of which you want to display the image.



- The icon in Play Control turns into 
  , and then the image is switched to that of the selected computer.
- While selecting the image to be projected in this screen, users other than the administrator cannot stop or start the projection using the connection software.
- When multiple users have logged on this screen, the only user who logged on first can operate. Users who logged on later cannot switch the image to be projected.
- 6. Click [Logout] after completing the operation.

### Selecting a language

You can select the language to be displayed in the administration screen between "English" and "Japanese".

- 1. Run the Web browser.
  - If the screen is not displayed, access "http://(the IP address of the projector)". The IP address of the projector is a numeric value displayed in "Server IP:" in the projected image.
  - Once the browser is closed, the setting is reset to the default as it is not to be saved.
- Click the pull-down menu on the upper right of the screen, and then select the language to be displayed.



### Configuring the projector

As well as changing the password, you can specify the settings for the network and the projection by logging on the system administrator screen.

### Glossary

TCP/IP	Transmission Control Protocol/Internet Protocol (TCP/IP) is the standard protocol used for network- ing. Protocol is a set of technical rules for the trans- mission of information between computers.
IP Address	IP Address is the numbered address to identify a server for networking. Internet Protocol (IP) is the protocol to transmit data over the Internet, and the IP Address, which consists of exactly same numbers as the other address in one network, is not available.
DHCP	Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol (DHCP) is the protocol dynamically allocating IP addresses to com- puters on a local area network. The computer with DHCP server can assign IP address to each com- puter on a local area network automatically.
Subnet Mask	Subnet is the separated part of network, and subnet mask is a number that defines a range of IP addresses that can be used in the network.
Gateway	Gateway is either hardware or software that acts as a bridge between two networks. Gateway is a sys- tem for transmitting data across networks that are incompatible and use different protocols.
WEP	Wired Equivalent Privacy (WEP) is a security proto- col that adds security by encrypting data. The encryption key enables only the authorized systems on the network to recognize the data.
SSID	Service Set ID (SSID) is the identifier for wireless local area networks, which identifies the access points necessary for transmitting. Some wireless local area network card uses [ESSID (Extended Ser- vice Set Identifier)] or network name as SSID.







  - Use a Category 5 cable.
- 2. Connect the other end of the Ethernet cable to the Ethernet port of the computer.
  - To project images, use the connection software. For details, see the sections B F and "G. Projecting images" in "Projecting images wirelessly". (See page 21 and 22.)

- When the wireless environment is poor, if you want to configure the network settings securely, or in other cases, use the connection.
- When turning on the devices, turn on the projector first, and then turn on the computer after the screen of the projector appears. If you turn on the computer first, the projector may not operate properly.
- Specify the settings for the "Internet Protocol (TCP/IP)" properties in "Local Area Connection" according to those specified in "Changing the network settings" (See page 27). In the default settings, "Obtain an IP address automatically" is selected.
- When you use the wired LAN connection, the MONITOR OUT terminal, AUDIO-IN terminal, and AUDIO-OUT terminal cannot be used.
- Do not touch the LAN terminal directly with your hand as you may be shocked by static electricity.

### BRIGHTNESS

Every time the ▶ button is pressed, the image becomes brighter. Every time the ◀ button is pressed, the image becomes darker.

### To adjust the color (COLOR and TINT):

You can adjust the color of the projected image using the menu. (See page 32 for the menu options.)

### About color temperature

There are different variations in white color. Color temperature is a way to show these variations in white. When the temperature is low, white appears reddish. When the temperature rises, white appears bluish. For example, you can change the temperature using the following procedures.

To raise the temperature: Increase CONTRAST B (blue) and decrease CONTRAST R (red).

To reduce the temperature: Decrease CONTRAST B (blue) and increase CONTRAST R (red).

• If you set CONTRAST R, G, and B to negative values, the brightness of the image can't retain the original even when you maximize the value of CONTRAST in the IMAGE menu.

### **Color Enhancer**

You can set user-defined values for the brightness and hue using the menu. (See page 32 for the menu options.)

- 1. Display the IMAGE menu.
- 2. Select COLOR ENHANCER by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.
- 4. Press the ENTER button.
- 5. Select a setting you want to set.

### GAMMA mode

Use this setting to set an optimal gamma value and modulation of lamp power. The level of brightness can be adjusted for subdued colors.

DYNAMIC	Select when viewing crisp, clear images in a brightly lit room or strong daylight. The level of brightness is adjusted to higher levels.
NATURAL	Select when viewing images of which colors are more faithfully reproduced. The level of brightness and vividness is adjusted to optimal levels.

Use to adjust the color intensity of the projected image. Every time the ▶ button is pressed, the color becomes thicker. Every time the ◀ button is pressed, the color becomes lighter.

## **RGB-TINT**

Use to adjust the color balance of the projected image. Every time the ▶ button is pressed, the image appears more greenish. Every time the ◀ button is pressed, the image appears more reddish.

This projector automatically and properly projects video signals being input from the computer. However, some video signals may not be projected, depending on the type of the computer. When it occurs, press the AUTO POSITION button. (See page 16.) When the signal is still not projected properly, adjust the projected image using the SIG-NAL menu.

# How to adjust the image supplied from the computer using the menu:

Perform the following procedures when the following conditions occur. When wide strips appear

..... adjust TRACKING in the SIGNAL menu.

When the projected image flickers

When the projected image is blurred

..... adjust FINE SYNC. in the SIGNAL menu.

When the projected image is displaced horizontally

Every time the ► button is pressed, the image moves up.

- When the top part of the image flags
  - ...... change the setting of HOLD in the SIGNAL menu. To select ON I , press the ENTER button, and adjust BEGIN or END to minimize the flagging.
- A solid black or solid white appears in the image ...... adjust CLAMP POSITION or CLAMP

WIDTH in the SIGNAL - USER menu.

- When the motion is not smooth.
  - .....adjust VERT. SYNC in the SIGNAL USER menu.

Select AUTO for most cases.

- Noise appears in the right or left half of the image.
- ......adjust SHUTTER(LS) or SHUTTER(RS) in the SIGNAL - USER menu.
- Noise appears in the top or bottom part of the image. .....adjust SHUTTER(U) or SHUTTER(L) in the SIGNAL - USER menu.

- 2. Repeat step 1 to complete the adjustment of the horizontal position.

#### To adjust the vertical position:

3. Align the upper edge of the image with the upper side of the screen by adjusting VERT.POSITION.

## LPF (Progressive filter)

You can select to enable or disable the LPF. This option is set to OFF normally.

Vertical or horizontal streaks may appear in the projected image, depending on the type of the DVD player, game console or computer in use. If this occurs, reduce noise by enabling the LPF. Projected images appear slightly faint.

#### Displaying a user-defined image during startup or muting

You can display your desired image as the startup screen (or splash screen). Using the menu, you can also use it as the background that is displayed while the video is muted or no signal is input.

### Important:

- You can't select IMAGE CAPTURE when PASSWORD FUNC-TION in the FEATURE menu is set to SPLASH ID SCREEN to activate the password lock.
- You can't select IMAGE CAPTURE when the component video signal is input.

- 2. Display your desired image.

- When the capture starts, the captured image will be displayed.
- When you press ENTER button once, any button doesn't function until the capture completes.
- When image resolution is lower than XGA(1024 x 768), the image is captured by adjusting its resolution to XGA.
- When image resolution is higher than XGA(1024 x 768), the image area of XGA is only captured.

#### Important:

- You can't change the new startup screen back to the original screen. (Even when you select RESET ALL in the FEATURE menu, the factory default screen is no longer effective.) When you want to change the startup screen again, capture another image.
- The captured images will be deleted at the same time as pressing the ENTER button. If you pressed ENTER button wrongly, try to capture the same images again.
- The captured image is displayed from the next startup. If the captured image isn't displayed, check to see if SPLASH SCREEN in the INSTALLATION menu is set to OFF. (See page 33.)
- To display the captured image while the video is muted, set AV MUTE MODE in the INSTALLATION menu to IMAGE. (See page 33.)
- When BACK COLOR in the INSTALLATION menu is set to IMAGE, the captured image is displayed while no signal is input.
- Some images can't be captured correctly because of their signal type.

# Freeze

# To stop the motion in the image temporarily (or to display a still image):

Press the FREEZE button on the remote control.

The image freezes temporarily.

## To resume the motion in the image:

Press the FREEZE button on the remote control again.

### Important:

 Do not keep displaying a still picture for an extended period of time, as the afterimages may linger on the screen.


# Page-up and page-down

You can go up and down the pages of a presentation projected from a computer using the remote control. Switch the pages using the PAGE UP or DOWN button on the remote control.

#### Connection

To manipulate images projected from the computer using the remote control, connect the projector with the computer as shown below.

- When the projector is connected with the computer via the USB port, the "Page up/down" function works if the computer supports the USB connection as a standard feature. (In some cases, it may not work.)
- "Page up/down" function when connecting with the USB cable cannot be supported in the Macintosh computer.
- Wait for the lamp to light up before connecting the USB cable.
- When the projector is connected using a longer cable, the image may not be projected correctly.
- When you use a longer cable, the use of the repeater is recommended.



## Password function

This projector provides the password function that is intended to prevent wrong operations by children and set controlled access for specified users.

- DISPLAY INPUT............When the projector is turned on, the startup screen (or splash screen) appears and stays on the screen until the password is entered. When the password is entered, the startup screen switches to the regular operation screen. MENU ACCESS ........All the buttons except for the POWER but-
- ton on the projector are disabled. (The buttons on the remote control are enabled.) You can use this mode to prevent wrong operations by children and set controlled access for specified users. SPLASH ID SCREEN.... IMAGE CAPTURE and SPLASH
  - SCREEN in the menu become unselectable. SPLASH SCREEN is set to ON automatically.

#### To enable the password function:

- 1. Display the FEATURE menu.
- 2. Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select PASSWORD FUNCTION.
- 3. Press the ◀ or ▶ button to change the mode among DISPLAY INPUT , MENU ACCESS , and SPLASH ID SCREEN .
  - When the password has already been set, the mode never changes. Press the ENTER button to cancel the password function and try again.
- 4. Press the ENTER button.
  - The screen for setting the password function appears.



- 1. Press the MAGNIFY button.
  - You can select the area to be magnified by pressing the ▲,

- 2. Press the MAGNIFY button again to exit the MAGNIFY mode.
  - The regular operation screen will appear.

#### Important:

• In the MAGNIFY mode, you can't adjust the volume.

# Lamp replacement

This projector is equipped with a lamp to project images. This lamp is a consumable. It may burn out or its brightness may decrease during use. In such cases, replace the lamp with a new one as soon as possible. Be sure to replace the lamp with a new lamp separately sold that is exclusive to this projector. Contact your dealer for purchase of the lamp.

Replace the spare lamp using the lamp attachment unit that is equipped with the spare lamp (separately sold) designed specifically for this projector.

Spare lamp for XD530U/XD530E: VLT-XD520LP


#### Caution:

- Do not remove the lamp immediately after using the projector. You
  may get burned because the lamp very hot after use.
- Before replacing the lamp, press the POWER button to turn off the lamp and wait for two minutes for lamp to cool down. Unplug the power cord from wall outlet and wait one hour for the lamp to cool down completely.
- Do not remove the lamp except for replacement. Careless handling can cause injury or fire.
- Do not touch the lamp directly. It may break and cause injury or burn.
- Be sure not to drop the lamp lid screw into the projector. Also be sure not to put metal or any flammable objects inside because it may cause fire or electric shock. If any objects should fall inside, unplug and contact your dealer.
- Install the lamp securely to prevent failure and fire.
- If the lamp should break, small glass fragments may fall out through the grilles and some may remain inside of the projector or the lamp box. When taking the lamp box out, be sure to turn over the projector and hold the handle of the lamp box to avoid injury due to the glass fragments.
- If the lamp should break, never shake the lamp box or hold it in front of your face after removing it. The lass fragments may fall out and cause injury to your eyes.
- Be sure to use the lamp dedicated to this projector, VLT-XD520LP for XD530U/XD530E. Use of other lamps may cause a failure of the projector.
- Do not use any other tools for replacing the spare lamp, and be sure to use the lamp attachment unit that is equipped with the spare lamp (separately sold) designed specifically for this projector. Use of other tools may cause a failure of the projector.


The lamp unit is fixed in position with two retaining claws (a) inside so the lamp attachment unit (b) designed specifically for this projector is required to replace the lamp.

Do not pull out the lamp forcibly. The lamp unit may be irretrievably damaged.

A new lamp unit can be installed without the lamp attachment unit.




1. Remove the screw (c) and slide the lamp cover (d) for removal.



Make sure that the projector is securely held in place.




When replacing the lamp, do not remove the screws other than those in the above picture. (Don't absolutely remove the screw marked with circle in the below picture. )




#### When the projector is mounted to the ceiling:

Secure the lamp attachment unit and the projector with the screw (f) that come with the lamp attachment unit. Otherwise, the lamp unit may fall from the inside and cause injuries.



 Contact your dealer when replacing the lamp unit with the projector mounted to the ceiling. 4. Pull up the handle (g), and then pull out the lamp unit (h) by the handle.



5. Remove the lamp attachment unit.



- Pull the lamp unit out of the projector slowly. If it is pulled out quickly, the lamp may break, scattering glass fragments.
- Do not spill liquid on the removed lamp unit or do not place it near any flammable object or where children can reach to prevent injuries or fire.

#### When the projector is mounted to the ceiling:

Confirm that the lamp unit (h) is securely held inside the lamp disposable bag of the lamp attachment unit. And then loosen the screw (f) that come with the lamp attachment unit. Then remove the lamp attachment unit.



- 6. Load a new lamp unit securely into the projector in the right orientation.
- 7. Tighten up the screw (c) using a Phillips screwdriver (+) to secure the lamp cover (d).
  - Make sure that the lamp cover is secured firmly. Otherwise, the POWER indicator flashes red and green, disallowing the projector to be powered on.

#### Reset of the lamp operation time

Plug in the power cord, and reset the lamp operation time by keep pressing the  $\blacktriangleleft$ ,  $\blacktriangleright$ , and POWER buttons on the control panel at the same time.

#### Important:

- Unless these three buttons are pressed at the same time, the lamp operation time isn't reset.
- Make sure that the STATUS indicator is lit twice and the lamp operation time is reset successfully.
- The projector doesn't turn on if the lamp cover isn't attached securely.

- Be sure to reset the lamp operation time whenever you replace the lamp.
- Do not reset the lamp operation time unless you replace the lamp.
   Caution:
- The lamp is fragile. If it is broken, be careful not to cut yourself with glass fragments.
- Contact your dealer for a new lamp.

# Interval of lamp replacement

When the lamp shutdown notice is issued, the lamp replacement is recommended even if the lamp is lit normally. Decrease in luminescence and/or color brightness indicates that the lamp needs to be replaced. When the lamp operation time exceeds the time elapsed until the lamp shutdown notice<sup>\*1</sup> is issued, the indicator will blink alternately green and red while the lamp replacement message will appear on the screen for one minute every time the lamp is turned on. When the lamp operation time exceeds the time elapsed until the lamp shutdown warning<sup>\*2</sup> is issued, the replacement message (LAMP EXCHANGE) will appear on the screen for one minute at fixed intervals<sup>\*4</sup> thereafter.

#### When the lamp operation time exceeds the time elapsed until the lamp shutdown<sup>'3</sup>, the projector automatically shuts off and can't be used until the lamp is replaced and the lamp operation time is reset.

# Maintenance

#### Warning:

Do not use flammable solvents (benzene, thinner, etc.) and flammable aerosols when cleaning the projector body and lens. Flammable substances may ignite causing fire or breakdown while the lamp is illuminating.

#### Caution:

Be sure to turn off the lamp and unplug the power cord from the wall outlet before you perform any maintenance on the projector.

#### Cleaning of the projector and the ventilation slots

Use a soft cloth to clean the projector and the ventilation grilles. When the grilles become dirty, wipe them with a soft cloth dampened with diluted mild detergent, and then wipe them with a dry cloth.

#### To protect the surface of the projector from fading or deteriorating:

- Do not spray insecticide on or inside the projector.
- Do not use benzin or thinner to clean it.
- Do not let rubber or plastic materials contact with projector.


#### Cleaning of the lens

Use a standard lens-cleaning brush or a piece of lens tissue dampened with lens cleaning fluid. The lens surface is fragile. Use only recommended, nonabrasive lens-cleaning materials. Do not touch the lens with your fingers.


